In celebration of the Global Warming and Climate Change Consciousness Week
Theme: *Reinforcing the Youth's Role in Stewardship of Biodiversity for Climate Stability*

I. Rationale

Biodiversity is fundamental to sustaining life as it supplies critical ecosystem services such as food provisioning, water purification, flood and drought control, nutrient cycling, and climate regulation. These services are essential to support human well-being and economic growth.¹ Yet despite its significance to economy, society, health and cultural systems, biodiversity worldwide is being destroyed at an unprecedented and accelerating rate.^{2,3}

According to a recent study, climate change is projected to negatively impact 273 biodiversity-rich areas across the globe.⁴ Moreover, in the Asia-Pacific region, population of large wild mammals and birds has declined due to habitat degradation and fragmentation, and illegal trades. Invasive alien species, which is considered to be one of the most serious threats to biodiversity, has increased in number and abundance as a consequence of growing volume of international trade, transportation improvements, and cross-border migration. Additionally, human-induced drivers such as agriculture intensification and a shift to monoculture, overfishing, pollution, infrastructure development, and land use conversions, as well as indirect socioeconomic and demographic changes create further stress to biodiversity threatening its survival.^{5,6}

Philippines is considered as one of the 17 megadiverse countries worldwide. However, it is also known as one of the “hotspot areas” where biodiversity is under tremendous threat of total destruction.⁷ Recognizing the role of knowledge and capacity building in biodiversity conservation, the

Grounded on our core values—*Maka-Diyos, Makatao, Makakalikasan, at Makabansa*, we remain committed to ensuring that our learners will grow into individuals who deeply care about the environment and ready to partake in its restoration,” said Secretary Leonor Magtolis Briones.

This is reaffirmed by Novie Kate Arellana, a B’laan Grade 6 pupil from Ladol Elementary School, Schools Division Office of Sarangani, who said that “*dapat tayong (fellow children) magkaroon ng kamalayan sa ating kapaligiran at dapat tayong magtulungan na mapabuti ang ating kinabukasan. Hindi dapat natin iniisip na bata pa tayo, dahil hindi naman basehan ang edad sa pagiging isang responsableng mamamayan.*”

With this year’s theme *Reinforcing the Youth’s Role in Stewardship of Biodiversity for Climate Stability*, the 5th National Climate Change Conference (NCCC) celebration aims to provide a platform to elevate discussions, strategize participatory and concrete actions that can be done to create meaningful change, and help the learners, personnel, and their families gain a deeper appreciation and awareness of the country’s vast biodiversity.

The Conference will be streamed through the DepEd Philippines Facebook page, making it accessible to learners, DepEd personnel, and the public all over the country. This will focus on the role of biodiversity to climate stability; thus, we will have a virtual field trip to the Danjungan Island to be conducted by Philippine Reef and Rainforest Conservation Foundation. Further, we will feature different youth advocates, and climate change and biodiversity experts as they discuss the relation between the two topics. Finally, the Conference will provide a platform for learners to voice out their demands for climate action and feature their pro-active response to the changing climate.

The participants of the *Green Beat Initiative (TGBI): An Online Environmental Journalism Training for Campus Journalists and School Paper Advisers* and *KaLIKHAsan! Likha at Lakas ng Kabataan para sa Kalikasan: An Online Theater Production and Climate Action Training* will showcase their skills, while increasing the awareness of climate change among their fellow learners on the conference. Also, we have invited the trained environmental journalists in TGBI 2020 to feature and cover the event. Providing a platform to reinforce the role of youth in stewardship of biodiversity plays a crucial role in increasing youth participation in climate action.

- Strengthen awareness of the role of biodiversity in climate stability among the education stakeholders; and
- increase participation of learners and DepEd personnel in climate change adaptation and mitigation interventions.

Specific Objectives:

- discuss the link of biodiversity and climate stability;
- discuss the role of youth on stewardship of biodiversity for climate stability;
- provide a platform for showcasing innovations on climate change adaptation and mitigation; and
- facilitate discourse and collaboration among learners, industries, social entrepreneurs, academe, civil society, and other stakeholders.

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Enclosure 2. Guide for the 5th National Climate Change Conference – Research Hour

A report from the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services reveals that nature is declining globally at rates unprecedented in human history, and the rate of species extinction is accelerating, with grave impacts on economy, food and water security, health, and quality of life worldwide.

Hence, to ensure that learners, personnel, families, communities, and other stakeholders are equipped with necessary knowledge and actively engaged in addressing biodiversity loss and climate change, the Department of Education (DepEd) through Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Service (DRRMS) is organizing an online celebration of the **5th National Climate Change Conference (NCCC)** on **19-25 November 2021** with the theme *Reinforcing the Youth's Role on Stewardship of Biodiversity for Climate Stability*.

Submission

Teaching and non-teaching personnel as well as learners who are interested to be research presenters for **Learning Session 7 – Research Hour** of the said event should submit an **abstract** of not more than 350 words at <https://bit.ly/DepEd5thNCCCResearchPresenter> on or before **08 November 2021**. The research abstract should be relevant to the conference theme and one of the sub-themes. The authors of accepted abstracts shall receive a notice of acceptance from the DRRMS by 10 November 2021.



Guidelines for Research Presenters

Upon acceptance, research presenters are required to submit video recordings or slide presentations with narration by **15 November 2021** at drmo+ccam@deped.gov.ph .

A. Content

1. Each presentation should not be more than **10 minutes** in length. Since time usually goes very fast when one is presenting, it would be best to state your key points or findings at the outset. Keep your introductory remarks very short (not more than 1 minute) and avoid reading every line on your slides.
2. To ensure that you are able to make a complete the presentation within the time allotment, do not prepare too many slides. If you spend one minute per slide, then the maximum number of slides for 10 minutes is 10 slides. If there is at least one slide that you need to explain more, then you should have fewer than 10 slides. **Tip:** After preparing all slides, review each to see how essential it is to your presentation, and then cut out slides that do not necessarily contribute to the overall presentation. Put key points first in case you run out of time.

B. Video Guide

- Record the video preferably with your smartphone for better resolution. You may also record through your laptop, webcam device, or a digital meeting platform such as Zoom and Google Meet.
- Dress code: solid-colored top preferably contrasting the color of your background. Avoid wearing tops with busy prints.
- Background: Ideally a clean or not busy. Backgrounds with nature or greenery elements are also preferred.
- The camera should be at eye-level. Make sure that you are at arm's length from the camera.
- The video frame size/ratio should be 16:9. If you are using your phone to record, you can set the ratio to 16:9.
- Sample video framing:



- ✓ Landscape orientation
 - ✓ Centered medium shot/ half-body
 - ✓ Proper head room/space between the top edge of the frame and the subject's head
 - ✓ Look directly at the camera.
- When recording, remember to project your voice clearly and properly. Observe proper pauses.
